

WHAT SHOULD I BRING TO THE 2012 EUREKA COLLEGE SUMMER CHORAL CAMP?

Any outstanding balance: will be due at registration. Cash or check (made out to Eureka College Summer Choral Camp) accepted.

Medical Form/Insurance Information: You will not be allowed to register without this!

Video Camera: We could probably use 3 more digital cameras for the *Funniest Camp Video Night*. Email me ASAP at jdhenry@eureka.edu if you have a camera that you can bring to camp!

Jabberwocky Prop: You'll need small, goofy prop for the performance of Lewis Carroll's *Jabberwocky* from *Through the Looking Glass*. The prop will be exposed to the audience $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way through the song so it needs to be small enough to hide. Suggestions: a New Year's Eve noisemaker; funny sun glasses, a funny hat/headpiece, a rubber chicken, etc.

Music for Private Lesson: If you signed up for a private lesson, please have a copy of the music you would like to sing organized in page order and ready to place in the piano accompanist's 3-ring rehearsal notebook binder! Must be submitted at registration! If you need to look at music for talent show auditions and/or private lessons, bring an extra copy of music for yourself. Looking over the accompanist's shoulder is not good etiquette.

Music for the Variety Show: Please bring all material that you'd like to use in the Talent Show and especially make sure that you have a copy of the music you would like to perform (or rehearse) organized in page order and ready to place in the piano accompanist's 3-ring rehearsal notebook binder! We're hoping that you'll all show off your talent by getting involved in the Variety Show! Must be submitted at registration!

Leave of Absence Form: Campers will NOT be allowed to leave campus unless a parent or guardian files a leave of absence form with either the Dean of Men or the Dean of Women. Forms will be available at registration. The form will also require the signature of either the Dean of Men or Women.

Spending money: The need for spending money varies from camper to camper. Camp fees cover the major expenses: tuition, housing, meals, but you'll want to plan for possible snacks, soft drinks, souvenirs (from the college bookstore), etc. The amount you bring should be decided between you and your parents/guardians. We do not advise bringing large amounts of cash that can be lost or stolen. The Eureka College Summer Choral Camp is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Bring coins for vending machines.

Clothing: Summer Music Campers receive highly favorable comments, not only about their orderly conduct, but on their neat appearance as well. Informal clothing in good taste is the usual dress for the day. Jeans, long pants, and shorts are appropriate. Bring a good pair of walking shoes or sneakers and remember it's always nice to have a second pair in case they get soaked during a downpour! Don't forget that concert clothing is simply the camp t-shirt with khaki dress slacks, capris, skirts & dress shoes. There's a good possibility that the college pool will also be available on selected evenings so it wouldn't hurt to stick a swim suit in your suitcase.

Other necessary items: You are responsible for bringing (1) twin-size bed linen (top/bottom sheets, blanket, bedspread or sleeping bag), (2) Pillow and pillowcase, (3) Bath towels, hand towels, and washcloths, (4) personal toiletries (toothbrush, soap, shampoo, make-up, hair dryer, etc. and (5) clothes hangers.

Other typical "camp like stuff" that might come in handy:

Flashlight, Alarm clock, Umbrella or rain gear, Small Mirror, Facial tissues, Sunglasses, Flip-flops, Notebook, Pencils & pens, Band-aids, Travel iron & board, Safety pins, moisturizing lotion, Munchies, Re-usable water-bottle, Reading lamp, Sneakers for the gym, Camera (extra film and batteries), Lip balm, Extension Cord, Stationery, stamps, and envelopes, Swimsuit, Bag, and Small waste basket.
